with the environments that have not been properly designed to provide recreation to a wider context of users.

Gwendolyn's Playground challenges the status quo and elevates play to be more for everyone. Inclusive play helps develop a true understanding of the world and encourages appreciation of the differences between people. More importantly, inclusive play recognizes our similarities and builds a more compassionate society.

A truly inclusive world in the future begins with more inclusive experiences now. Inclusion creates a ripple effect that benefits not only the person being included, but also shapes the perceptions of peers. When we have experiences with difference, we think beyond ourselves. And when we start viewing differences as unique gifts, a truly inclusive world is possible.

A tenacious little girl who loved nothing more than being one of the kids, Gwendolyn Strong is the inspiration behind Gwendolyn's Playground. Born with Spinal Muscular Atrophy (SMA), Gwendolyn was profoundly physically disabled and medically fragile but that never affected her sense of fun. Despite ADA compliant playgrounds throughout the area, not a single one allowed Gwendolyn to play alongside her many friends or participate fully in public spaces with her peers.

After ten years of advocacy and non-profit work offering practical support to families and funding research that led to a treatment and a groundbreaking potential cure for SMA, the Strong family set their sights on spearheading the first truly inclusive playground in the region in Gwendolyn's memory.
